I am sure they too did not like all they heard. **Acts 20:27 (ESV) — 27** for I did not shrink from declaring to you the whole counsel of God.

Even though these truths were presented with tears and through trials, Paul still spoke up.

Acts 20:19–21 (ESV) — 19 serving the Lord with all humility and with tears and with trials that happened to me through the plots of the Jews; **20** how I did not shrink from declaring to you anything that was profitable, and teaching you in public and from house

Micah 6:8 (NIV) "He has showed you, O man, what is good. And what does the Lord

require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God."

In the Sunday morning adult class Tom Painter was teaching from Micah when a discussion regarding Micah 6:8 started about what it means to "act justly", to "love mercy" and to "walk humbly". From the discussion I came away with the following understanding:

To "act justly" means to treat one another right, to be fair and to not take advantage of others.

To "love mercy" means to provide others grace as a way of life, not just when it's convenient.

To "walk humbly" means to restrain from the pride of life, to have humility, but more importantly to trust God's will that you will seek a relationship with Him and follow Him.

"And what does the Lord require of you?"

God has made his wishes clear, He wants His people to be just, merciful and humble, which means not just doing religious deeds, but living rightly.

The result of preaching the whole counsel of God was profound:

Acts 19:4–5 (ESV) — 4 And Paul said, "John baptized with the baptism of repentance, telling the people to believe in the one who was to come after him, that is, Jesus." **5** On hearing this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus... **10** This continued for two years, so that all the residents of Asia heard the word of the Lord, both Jews and Greeks.
