Matthew 11:28-30 - Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. [29] Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me,

for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. [30] For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

Henry David Thoreau wrote, "The mass of men lead lives of quiet desperation." 170 years later, things have probably only gotten worse. We fill our days with busyness. We frantically move from one thing to the next, never pausing to catch our breath, until we are exhausted. At work, we spend our time climbing the ladder. They hold our feet to the fire. It's Labor Day. It's time for most of us to take a break from school and work and spend some time relaxing and enjoying the last days of summer. Take some time this weekend, step away from it all, and focus on what it is really important to you.

STRENGTH TO SERVE by Brad Herald

Last week we started our first session of Dave Ramsey's Financial Peace University program. During the instructional video, one of the financial counselors was talking about her own personal experience with money as she meekly expressed, "she was living in her strengths" when she was spending money. This reminded me of one of the verses Dad used to encourage all of the new and existing Deacons to rededicate ourselves to service for the church.

Romans 12:6-8 (NIV) ⁶We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your faith; ⁷if it is serving, then serve; if it is teaching, then teach; ⁸if it is to encourage, then give encouragement; if it is giving, then give generously; if it is to lead, do it diligently; if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully.

God does not turn His back on us. No matter how bad or vile the pit may be that we end up in. Realizing this Hagar replied:

Genesis 16:13 (ESV) So she called the name of the LORD who spoke to her, "You are a God of seeing," for she said, "Truly here I have seen him who looks after me."

LADIES FAITH DEVOTIONAL

"WITHOUT EXCUSE" by Melissa Denham

Being a woman of faith, I try to follow the Biblical examples of human interaction. Of late, I keep thinking about the Good Samaritan in Luke 10:33-37. Christ states very clearly that the Samaritan was the Jewish traveler's neighbor because he saw a human in need and assisted him. What is so striking to me is that Christ doesn't give us ANY excuses for not helping someone in need.

There are no qualifiers that relieve us of doing the right thing for a person in need. Nowhere in God's Word are we told to determine if the people in need are deserving of our help. We aren't told to make sure they aren't thieves, liars or heroin addicts before helping them. In fact, in Matthew 25:34-40, Christ tells us those on His right will inherit the Kingdom prepared for them because when he was hungry you gave him food, thirsty you gave him food



and in prison you visited him...going on later to explain doing this to the "least of these", you did it to him.

While Christ doesn't give us an excuse for not helping, he also doesn't tell us how we must help. I think that is where we must use good judgment. We can take someone to lunch rather than giving them money for food or paying their heat bill directly to the utility company instead of giving the funds to make the payment. Perhaps we put gas directly into the someone's gas tank when they say they need gas to get home. We can also look to each other for ideas of how we can best help those in need in our community. As Christians, we should be ever striving to be light in a dark world.
