WHY MUST I SUFFER SO?

The command rings out from God to store up comfort: Isaiah 40:1 (ESV)
Comfort, comfort my people, says your God.

God was about to restore His people. So, Isaiah was to speak tenderly to Jerusalem. Her warfare was ended, and her sins were pardoned.

But then the prophet continues to give a message that would develop a people prepared to comfort an entire world: Isaiah 40:3-5 (ESV) A voice cries: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD; make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. And the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken."

You see, friend, the way God's message goes out is through His Church offering comforting counsel to a world that is not well. Now that "the Lord has spoken" I have two questions to spur us to action: First, are you part of the helpers who bring comfort and peace or the torturers who erect confusing stumbling blocks?

And, secondly, don't you also find it paradoxical that comfort is best felt in a broken heart? Is it not a paradox that the fragrance of a rose is only fully released when crushed?

Paul clears up these paradoxes in 2 Corinthians 1:3-7 (ESV). Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our affliction, SO THAT WE MAY BE ABLE TO COMFORT THOSE WHO ARE IN ANY AFFLICTION, with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God.

For as we share abundantly in Christ's sufferings, so through Christ we share abundantly in comfort too. If we are afflicted, it is for your comfort and salvation; and if we are comforted, it is for your comfort, which you experience when you patiently endure the same sufferings that we suffer. Our hope for you is unshaken, for we know that as you share in our sufferings, you will also share in our comfort.

Here is Paul's paradox made even more clear: the crushing of my heart allows me to comfort others with the comfort I have received. But I must never forget that the comfort I use is from God. That means, I am merely to be a conduit through which God's comfort can easily flow.

So, here is the answer to "why must I suffer so" – it is so that I can comfort others. But, with the real goal of God's glory being revealed when the world looks at the soul that should be crushed, but now is overflowing with peace and joy instead.

Has your heart been crushed? Then stop asking why and start living the answer so God's glory may be revealed.

FREEDOM AND ACCOUNTABILITY BY CORI FULLER

As an entrepreneur, one of the things I struggled with at the beginning was being accountable. I LOVE freedom and flexibility, and wasn't that one of the reasons I was working for myself, so I didn't have to answer to anyone else?! There were people I COULD have been accountable to, but I didn't HAVE to be. There were no punishments if I didn't. So, for a while, I didn't!

Let me tell ya how that worked out.... Turns out, when you only work when you feel like it, you sometimes don't work very often. Fast forward a few years, I made a decision that ended up changing everything. It was one of those oddly defining moments, where I can remember where I was and what the room around me looked like, even though I had no idea at the time how significant that decision would be. I decided that no matter what, I was going to be accountable every single week.

Inch by inch, I found myself becoming more consistent. I found myself more eager to do the work. I found myself and my business growing. Most surprisingly, I found myself feeling more FREE. That one didn't make any sense to me- how is that possible?

Doing what I knew I should, what I really wanted to have been doing all along, built my character and produced a sense of freedom in me.

Many of us likely began this year with some intentions to improve an area or two of our life. For many of us this might have included things like attending worship more regularly, becoming involved in a bible class, reading our Bible more, or praying more often. Rightfully so, as these are some of the most important intentions we could make during our earthly journey.

Did you know that January 17th has been dubbed "Ditch your New Year's Resolution Day?" It's thought that by that day, many have already abandoned the intentions they set just 17 days before! For many who find themselves there, one key element that's missing could be accountability.

Thankfully, God knew this about us ahead of time, and set us up with built in accountability in His church, our spiritual family. Proverbs 27:17 tells us "Iron sharpens iron, and one man sharpens another." 1 Thessalonians 5:11 says, "Therefore encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing."

Just as being accountable in our jobs helps us to be more productive or reach a goal, so can being accountable with our spiritual family help us grow in our faith. It's not something that can happen overnight, as it takes time to open ourselves up to accountability. Where could you step out in faith this week that could begin to set you up for greater accountability in our church family?

Have we shared our spiritual goals or intentions with our church family, who could help encourage us? Hebrews 10:24 says, "And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works."

Start a conversation with someone we have maybe never talked with?

Make a decision to attend a Sunday evening service, come early for class, or attend a Wednesday evening bible study?

Invite someone into your home for a meal to get to know them better?

As a church family, we have responsibility here too. Galatians 5:13-14 says, "For you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another. For the whole law is fulfilled in one word: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."" We are called to love each other, and to watch out for one another. Find ways to serve each other. Notice our church family members who might be struggling. Lend a helping hand when and where we see needs. Taking time to stop and notice each other. Encourage those we see taking a step out in faith. Send a card. Say a prayer. Share a kind word.

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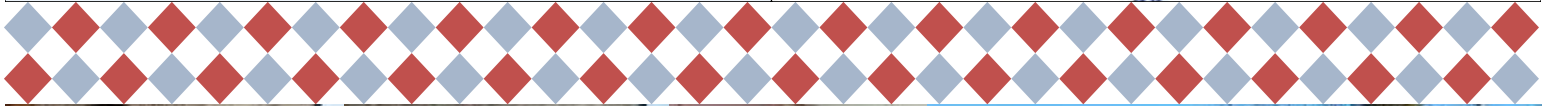
