## WHAT OCCUPIES YOUR MIND

Nearly one in five Americans suffer from mental illness (46.6 million t.ly/1V6VE). And the number one reason why people don't get help is the high cost involved. It is for this reason that Summit offers free to inexpensive Christian Counseling.

Several years ago, a group called "Occupy Wall Street" riled against the stock market elite. Maybe you too had a cause you felt strongly against – that occupied your mind for a time. Or you might find your mind occupied by an addiction that is consuming your every waking moment. Or it may be anger towards someone who has hurt you. It might even be a situation that you have innocently been drawn into – like the death of a spouse or child. Or your mind may be occupied by unforgiveness – some deep hurt from your past.

Whether what occupies your mind is good, neutral or evil – since the creation of the World, God has jealously desired that position. In Mt.6 Jesus makes it clear that we cannot serve two masters. Either God or money (Wall Street) will be our master.

All must make a choice as to what we will allow to occupy our minds. It is impossible for our brain to focus on two things at the same time. Would it not be great if our minds were filled all day with appreciative thoughts as we meditate on God? Psalm 119:103 (ESV) — 103 How sweet are your words to my taste, sweeter than honey to my mouth!

What are the different things we can allow to occupy our minds?

- Your mind could be occupied like the bitter Lemonhead. You are stuck in unforgiveness & anger which leads to bitterness. Would it not be great if you could forgive? If that person/event could stop controlling your every waking moment?
- Your mind could be occupied like the anxious Twizzlers. You are all twisted up because you are worried about the future.
- Your mind could be occupied like the confusing gingerbread. You are working synergistically with the current culture – not wanting to offend anyone. And so, you fail to be true to God's core values inside your heart, choosing political correctness instead.

## THE CHURCH OF CHRIST

In our continued study of "Why I am a member of the Church of Christ", this week in the pre-teen class we reviewed what the members of the church are called. We first looked at names that are based on the Bible but are not scriptural ways to identify members of the church.

I am sure that practices and methods should be used to complete the Lord's work, but we are not to be called Methodists.

We agree that it takes immersion under water to complete the act of baptism, but we are not to be called Baptists.

The church should have bishops (Greek word episcopos) or deacons to do the work of the

church, but we are not to be called Episcopalians.

The church should have elders (Greek work being presbuteros) to oversee the flock, but we are not to be called Presbyterians.

According to Acts 20:7, disciples, which are learners or followers, came together to break bread upon the first day of the week.

1 Corinthians 1:2 describes the members at Corinth as saints, denoting they were saved from past sins.

1 Corinthians 15:6 uses the name brethren, which suggests a relationship to each other in Christ.

In Acts 11:26, the followers of Christ were given a new name, Christians.

To be scriptural, we must identify both the church and its members as scripture directs. Man-made names should be avoided, and the name of Christ adopted.
