One of the easiest things to do in life is to find a way to get by without putting forth much effort. Accomplish the bare minimum to finish the task at hand. The end goal is to be average. These can range from what takes place in the classroom, at work, or in our personal lives. Have we ever attempted to do the bare minimum with our faith? Have we ever just done the minimum that we believe will be satisfactory enough to God?
