## How to Split a Church

You have the right to use your time, money, and words however you want (you live in the USA, not communist China). Did those at Corinth and Rome not have the right to eat meat? How much the more do we as Americans have the freedom to live our lives how we want? For if you do not stand up for your rights and yourself, everyone else will just walk all over you.
